



Michael Fitzgerald has written and edited numerous publications on world religions, predominantly American Indian spirituality. Mr. Fitzgerald has taught Religious Traditions of the North American Indians in the Indiana University Continuing Studies Department at Bloomington, Indiana. He is a licensed attorney and holds a Doctor of Jurisprudence, cum laude, from Indiana University. Michael is an adopted son of the late Thomas Yellowtail, one of the most honored American Indian spiritual leaders of the last century, and was also adopted into the Crow tribe by Yellowtail. Michael and his wife, Judith, have attended sacred rites of many American Indian tribes and have spent extended periods of time visiting traditional cultures and attending sacred ceremonies throughout the world.

They have an adult son and live in Bloomington, Indiana. The Fitzgerald family has also deeded 342 acres located in both Santa Fe, New Mexico and Bloomington, Indiana into permanent conservation easements to prevent any future development. He has also edited with his wife, Judith, *Indian Spirit* (World Wisdom, 2003) and *Christian Spirit* (World Wisdom, 2004).
